Federico Lega, Ph.D, is Director of the Mihmep. He's professor at Bocconi University, where he teaches the courses in Public Management and Health Services Management and leads the Strategy and Organizational Development research in healthcare at Bocconi research center on health policy and management (CERGAS). He's been Coordinator and Director of the Bocconi Italian Master in healthcare management (MiMS) and Head of executive education for health managers and clinicians at Bocconi School of Management (SDA), where he teaches in several executive courses and at the "Master of Healthcare Management, Economics and Policy" (MIHMEP). Since 2005 was appointed Adjunct Professor of the Department of Health Services Administration at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, USA, and has been visiting scholar at INSEAD and HSMC at Birmingham University, UK. Since 2007 he's also visiting research fellow at York management school. His research interests focus on organization and management of healthcare institutions and on modernization and innovation processes in Hospitals. He published four books and several articles on journals. As consultant he has advised several hospitals and networks in re-organizations and strategy-making processes both at national and international level. Since 2002 he has coordinated several initiatives of duality or study-tour, involving the exchange of managers and senior clinicians between countries (Italy, UK, USA, Germany and France). He currently seats in the boards of hospitals and local health authorities, and he's the chair of the scientific advisory committee of the European Healthcare Management Association (EHMA). From September 2015 he's the chief editor of Health Services Management Research.
